FROM THE PULPIT SIDE

Are you having a “good” day or a “bad” day? Sometimes the day’s events are beyond our control, but our reaction to them is fully ours! Here is an old Yiddish folktale that helps us maintain a positive outlook:

An old man sat outside the walls of a city. When travelers approached, they would ask the old man, “What kind of people live in this city?” The old man would answer, “What kind of people lived where you came from?” If the traveler responded, “Only bad people lived where I came from”, then the old man would reply, “Then travel on...you will find only bad people here.” But if the traveler answered, “Good people lived in the place I came from”, then the old man would say, “Enter, for here, too, you will find only good people.”

The obvious moral of this story is that we reflect back to others the values and focus of our own lives. If we wish to be around good people, then we should be good people. What others see in you is really your sermon! We should strive to reflect God’s love for us toward others, that they, too, may feel God’s love for them. Our Bible reveals a wonderful thought:

“How sweet are your words to my taste! Yes, sweeter than honey to my mouth! From your principles I get understanding; therefore, I hate every false way.” (Psalm 119:103-104)

So, if you happen to catch me in a mood that is less than optimistic or helpful, it means that I have forgotten to reflect God’s loving, spiritual means to focus on the important things. Let’s make sure that everyone entering our city (our church) from any direction will be assured that only “good” people live here...because God has granted to us all the ability to share his love! Peace Garden Update

Last week Mike Ainley harvested 41 green peppers (11 lbs.), 31 cucumbers (24 lbs.), and 93 tomatoes (41 lbs.). For the year we have harvested 179 cucumbers, 195 tomatoes and 130 peppers weighing over 293 pounds from the Peace Garden. It looks like we are going to have a great harvest this year. We are on pace to harvest more vegetables than last year. At this time last year, we had only harvested 248 pounds of vegetables compared to the 293 pounds harvested this year. Thanks to everyone that has been watering and weeding the garden. Keep up the good work. Also, please remember if you are unable to water on your designated day please switch with someone else.

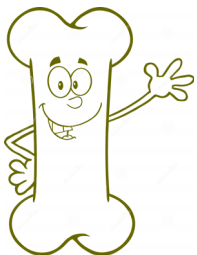
